## “I Want Your Money”

*New film skewers Obamanomics with a tough look at big government spending*

Controversy surrounds a new documentary film that takes a hard look at two versions of the American dream and the ballooning federal deficit's effect on the future.

“I Want Your Money” contrasts progressivism and capitalism, using the words and actions of presidents Obama and Ronald Reagan. It takes aim at the Obama agenda and economic record just before the elections.

Filmmaker Ray Griggs shows the stark choice between two views of the role of the federal government.

One views the money you earned as yours and best allocated by you; the other champions a Washington elite who know best how to spend others' money.

California's economic challenges are offered as a case-in-point consequence in choosing the big government alternative.

“I Want Your Money” exposes the high cost in lost freedom and opportunity that result from supporting an ever-expanding bureaucratic state.

The film uses interviews, movie clips, dramatic portrayals, music, graphics and comedic animation. It was made to appeal to a younger audience, with logos and animation designed by a *Mad Magazine* artist.

The film will go into nationwide release Oct. 15, but Malibu/Bel-Air Republican Women Federated will host a special preview screening Oct. 5 at Pepperdine University.

## ANDREW BREITBART AT PEPPERDINE



*Commentator and author Andrew Breitbart spoke Sept. 20 in Malibu.*

Speaking to Malibu Republicans Sept. 20, Internet news publisher and media commentator Andrew Breitbart outlined his war with the mainstream media and his activism in "taking back our country."

The MBA-RWF event at Pepperdine University drew almost 100 on a weeknight to hear Breitbart, who is author of *Hollywood, Interrupted* and publisher of five news portals, including Breitbart.com.

Breitbart recently made a splash with his biggovernment.com blog, which broke the Acorn prostitution scandal. He is a frequent speaker at Tea Party protests. His comments included strategies for grassroots change to fight big government and the liberal agenda.

He also spoke about the challenges faced when confronting left-wing attacks by bullies, including professional union protestors who seem like "Astroturf" next to "grassroots," or everyday citizens who care.

## Political correctness runs amok LONGTIME UCLA RESEARCHER FIRED FOR CONTRARY FINDINGS

Debate continues over the firing of UCLA epidemiologist James Enstrom, who recently was dismissed after 36 years at the prestigious university for what some call politically incorrect research.

Enstrom was told that he would not be rehired because his research "is not aligned" with the university's academic mission. But the timing points toward Enstrom's conflict with the California Air Resources Board and its new standards on diesel emissions.

The non-tenured professor's research found no causal link between diesel emissions and early death. Not only did Enstrom question the science behind the board's new standards, he exposed one of its researcher's faked doctorate and term limit violations on the board.

Those embarrassing revelations drew scrutiny to the board at a time when it's imposing an estimated \$5.5 billion in new emissions standards on

the California trucking industry.

The controversy has drawn concern among those seeking to protect academic freedom. Enstrom's popularity among his peers, divergent political views and "negative" research results—all of which may have played a role in his dismissal—portend repercussions for others with unpopular positions.
