Dear Members and Associates,



Everyone must focus on the upcoming November 4 General Election. I have been doing this for the past several months. On Monday, September 22, I had the pleasure of attending a fundraiser in Beverly Hills for three great Republican U.S. Senatorial candidates: Dan Sullivan of Alaska, Tom Cotton of Arkansas, and Cory Gardner of Colorado.
